

## Ellen Frank

Artist Ellen Frank



Acclaimed painter, writer and scholar Ellen Frank is the recipient of numerous awards including a National Endowment in the Humanities, a Ford Foundation grant in Lithography, a Pollock-Krasner Award in Painting, and two New York State Council on the Arts awards including the prestigious Individual Artist Award, specifically for her Illumination Atelier Project, an apprenticeship program in the art of manuscript illumination. She is also the author of the critically-acclaimed *Literary Architecture: Essays Toward a Tradition*, which was named "Best Publication in 50 Years" by the University of California Press, as well as essays on painting, architecture and literature.

Ms. Frank brings her extraordinary gifts to her illuminated paintings, works which range from monumental public installations on linen to small illuminated manuscripts on papyrus and vellum. Critics have called her paintings "amazing achievements," "breathtakingly beautiful" and "fueled by flashes of insight, revelation, and epiphany." Her scholarship and technique combine to make her illuminated manuscripts lasting works in the tradition of the early medieval artists who painted with gold to capture light. Rendered in glittering, sensuous hues, her paintings are meticulously researched, rich in symbolism, provocative, and revelatory in their portrayal of the ancient stories which find form in her illuminated pages.

Ms. Frank, whose formal education includes a Ph.D. in Literature and the Visual Arts from Stanford University, studies in Italian art history (with a Yale University Fellowship) and in Aesthetic Theory with a Fulbright Fellowship to London, and studies at the San Francisco Art Institute, has been creating illuminated manuscripts for the past decade, incorporating 22-karat gold leaf on vellum, linen and handmade papers. Ms. Frank was invited to inaugurate "T" at the Soho Guggenheim with a sequence of 18 paintings on linen and panels; and in 1999 Ms. Frank was commissioned to create an 84-foot mural in gold, copper and silver leaf on linen. She exhibits widely in the U.S. and internationally.

In 2001, Ms. Frank was Guest Artist and Professor at Barnard College and at Rutgers University. She continues to mentor students privately and through the Illumination Atelier Project, which she founded in 2000 in an effort to disseminate the fugitive techniques of manuscript illumination to fellow artists.
